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SIMPSON CROSSING PART 1

11TH TO 16TH JULY 2024 WORDS & PHOTOS: SHEZ TEDFORD

Our group met in Broken Hill on Thursday the 4th of July.

The original plan was to head to Cameron Corner, Innamincka and Cordello Downs. We would head up the Arrabury Road to Haddon Corner and then meet up with the Birdsville Developmental Road and into Birdsville. Unfortunately, we had to decide on a plan B as heavy flooding rains had closed all roads to and beyond Cameron Corner.

We also carried on a tradition set back with the Nappers, where someone was nominated each day to wear a comical hat. This would be the result of anything from a goof up, stitch up, or it could be given for a positive deed. The hat was presented each morning before we left camp. It was a bit of fun and we all got a laugh.

On the 5th we headed for Hungerford and found a great little camping area opposite the Hungerford pub. The publican informed us he was heading out at 5am the next morning and the pub would be closed for at least a week as the rains were heading this way and would close the roads. Taking no chances, we were up early next morning and on the road. We needed to get back to the black top or we risked being stranded in Hungerford and that would have been the end of our trip before it begun.

This provided spectacular views across the surrounding landscape. Our next stop was the Beetoota pub. This iconic pub, in the middle of nowhere, is a must stop for anyone



heading to or from Birdsville.

Finally, we got into Birdsville and met up with Danni and Damo who had been waiting there for us. After we all got set up, we headed over to the pub for dinner. Gotta go to the pub - it's a tradition!

DAY 1 - Thursday 11th July

Hip Hip Hooray - Happy Birthday to Wayne. After a stop at the Birdsville Bakery, we finally began our trip in earnest.

First stop of course was Big Red. Most of us had a play on the big red dune, got some photos and had some fun. The main track across from Big Red was still very wet, with deep pools of water and boggy from the recent rains. Warren decided we could give it try and see if we could make it across to the other side. Well, this failed miserably, and we got stuck in one of the very deep pools of muddy water. The 4by tilted slightly to the left and water poured in, flooding my socks and anything else on the floor.

Tim tried to get to us on the same route, but he became bogged near the start. Wayne eventually got him out. Tim then came around the bottom of the dune near Little Red and finally got to us.

Between Tim and Warren, they got













the winch hooked up and got us out. Thanks Tim! The rest of the group drove around the other side of the base and met us on the far side. We continued our trip West on the QAA line. At lunch we gave Wayne a little cupcake for his birthday.

We arrived at Eyre Creek which was still quite deep. Colin walked into the creek to the other side testing the depth. It was decided we could cross. We all crossed easily although Geoff did a tyre which required changing.

With the creek crossing done we continued our adventure across the amazing dunes. The desert was bursting with colour from the recent rains. Wildflowers carpeted the landscape. So lush and green it resembled a savannah rather than a desert. Danni and I were expecting to see giraffes and wildebeest lopping across the tracks. Of course, we didn't!

We didn't get as far as we had anticipated the first day. We found a great camp and set up for the night. Warren had heard a noise coming from one of the brakes. Turned out we had a seized calliper. Thankfully, with the help of the sat phone, we could ring through to Mount Dare and have a set of brakes flown in from Alice Springs. We would fix the brakes in Mount Dare.

Damo was anxiously searching for his hat. It was on his head the whole time.

DAY 2 - Friday 12th July

Today we got to Poeppels Corner. Everyone spent some time and took all the obligatory photos. We drove around Poeppels Lake and met up with the French Line.

Tim had to replace a damaged front wheel bearing. Jimmy got stuck in and it wasn't too long and the repair was done so we could continue our quest.

The rest of the day went well. We

found another amazing camp site and settled in for another night under cloudless starry skies. So many amazing places to camp, we were spoilt for choice.

DAY 3 - Saturday 13th July

We turned off the French Line onto Knolls Track, right onto the WAA Line and then onto Errabena Track to make our way down to the Lone Gum. Errabena was a corrugated, bone shaking, 4by rattling mongrel track.

alongside of them.

There was so much bird life in the desert. The most prolific were the bright green wild budgies. There were so many of them. Hawks and finches were also noticeable in this wild landscape.

We eventually turned back onto the French Line and now we were once again travelling over the dunes - lots of fun.

We stopped for lunch and Wayne discovered he had broken a rear spring. He had to drive like this the rest of the way into Mount Dare. Jimmy had to use the angle grinder and trim his guards.

We had a brief stop at Purni Bore. Saw some pretty finches and other native birds. We decided to keep going and get into Dalhousie Springs. It was quite late when we got in. We got set up and settled in for the night.

DAY 5 - Monday 15th July

Most of our group left early after a refreshing swim in the warm springs and headed into Mount Dare. Wayne was keen to get his springs ordered from Alice Springs.

Danni and Damo, Warren and myself stayed and had lunch in Dalhousie and then we detoured out to the Dalhousie ruins. This is a very interesting area and the ruins told many a story of a bygone era. The stock yards were still standing and brickwork on most of the buildings still intact. A real testament to how well stonework and yards were put together back then.

We then made our way into Mount Dare. Our brakes were waiting for us, it wasn't long and Warren had the new brakes fitted. We all had dinner at the pub.

DAY 6 - Tuesday 16th July

Wayne was anxiously waiting his new springs which were coming in

from Alice Springs. Initially they were coming in by plane. However, they were apparently too heavy adding excess weight on the plane, so they were coming by road. Wayne was informed they would be in Mount Dare by 5pm.

Almost on Q the truck arrived at 5pm with the springs to a very relieved Wayne. With a little bit of help, the new springs were fitted which was a huge relief.

The first part of our trip was fabulous. Plenty of laughs, banter, a few 4by fixes and late nights.

We must thank Colin - He bought along a homemade folding toilet and each night found a secluded spot, dug a hole and we had a decent drop bush toilet to cater for our needs. Sitting out in the middle of the desert with the wind whistling up the ????? looking out into the open landscape. Pretty good!
