
Date: Saturday 12th October


On Tuesday we all packed up and made our way back to Geelong (via KFC of course). Another great weekend away, with lots of laughs and memories!

After 2 days in Mount Dare to repair vehicles and have some down time, it was time to begin the second half of our Simpson adventure.

We left Mount Dare and crossed into the Northern Territory. We were taking a slight detour as we wanted

to go to the Lambert Centre. (The Geographical Centre of Australia). The track in is a bit of fun. We got to the iconic landmark and took all the obligatory photos and made this place a lunch stop. For many of our group this was a bucket list tick, including Warren and myself.

Coming out of the Lambert Centre Danni and Damo in their RAM hit a nasty washout which burst a front airbag and destroyed the front tyre and rim. The tyre was repaired at the site, but more room was needed to replace the airbag. Damo limped the RAM back to the main road where

there was plenty of room to get the airbag changed. Thankfully Danni and Damo carried spare airbags and after an hour or so the job was done and we were back on the road.

We made a brief stop in Finke to top up fuel and continued our journey. Our first night we camped at the historic Old Andado Station.

This beautiful old station is like a time capsule. Walking through the homestead you can really get a sense of life as it would have been back in the earlier days. The dinner table was still set with crockery. Blankets and linen still in the cupboards and plenty of memorabilia on Molly and her life on this outback station. There are plenty of out buildings, old vehicles and sheds to wander through.

If anyone wishes to know more about this amazing place just Google Old Andado Station. Donations are asked for camping. These donations help to maintain the homestead.

We set up our camps and then Danni and I got started on the prep for our big camp oven roast dinner. Dinner was delicious. Roast beef and all the trimmings.

The next morning, we packed up and continued towards the Madigan line.













We stopped for a look at the old and rare Waddi Trees (Acacia Puce). These trees are only found in 3 areas of Australia. Here near Old Andado, Boulia and Birdsville.

Finally, we came to the beginning of the Madigan Line. Again, for many of us this iconic Simpson track was a bucket list tick and finally we were here. Of course we had the obligatory photos, got to do it!

We were making really good time and decided to take the track in to try and find the Madigan Line Camp 1. We think we got close but unfortunately, we did not find the marker. We came back out to the main track and had lunch at Camp 1A.

We continued along the line and made camp at Camp 5. There was plenty of room to spread out. A fire was made and we settled in for another night under a million stars. The weather so far had been perfect. Mild warm days and cool nights. Perfect desert crossing weather.

The track was rugged in sections, but we still made really good time.

The next night we made camp between Camps 11 and 12. We continued our journey with an everchanging landscape. The dunes were not huge, and we again made good time.

We eventually turned onto the Hay River Track. After Madigan Camp 16 is the track which leads to Adria Station. This is still part of the Madigan Line, and it had been our intention to travel this which would see us complete the entire Madigan Line. Unfortunately, the heavy rains and flooding prevented us from taking this route. I have been in touch with the owners of Adria who had said it was impassable.

We continued along the Hay River Track and had some fun dunes to play on along the way. We found a great camp off the Hay River track with plenty of room for our convoy.

Tonight, the big screen came out by way of Starlink. Camping in the middle of the desert watching live footy and song requests as we rocked the desert. It was a fun night and our second last night in the beautiful Simpson.

The next day we left camp and made our way down to the QAA line. We found another great camp for our last night in the desert. Again, the fire was built and we all settled in for another amazing night with a magical sunset.

Our last morning and Tim discovered he had a rear spring tower crack which damaged the fuel line from his reserve tank. He had to syphon fuel from his reserve tank to his main tank to have enough fuel.

We were now travelling the opposite way on the QAA and the ruts seemed bigger and rougher so the going was slow in parts. Eventually we had Big Red in our sights, and sadly our adventure was almost complete.

However, the desert wasn't quite done with us yet!

We all climbed back over Big Red having some fun as we did. I had a













ball driving this incredible dune. Damo fired the RAM up and started up the dune, he was going up one of the hardest climbs. On the second attempt he gave the RAM a bit more juice and put the fan through the radiator. By the time he crested Big Red water was pouring out of the radiator.

Geoff towed Damo and Danni back into Birdsville and into the caravan park. The radiator was taken out of the RAM and initially it looked grim.

The next morning everyone except Warren, Danni, Damo and myself left the group and made their own way back to Geelong.

We stayed with Danni and Damo to help with repairs. Warren was able to repair the radiator. We spent the next two days in Birdsville to make sure the radiator leak had sealed. One last time the four of us headed out to Big Red to witness a magical sunset and to have a drink on the iconic dune.
