COFFS HARBOUR TRIP

Saturday 14th

The first day of the trip was a full day traveling to get to Bathurst. Once we arrived we all meet up at the Macquarie woods campground.

Sunday 15th

On Sunday we headed off to do the Bridle Track from camp, and then a slow lap around Mount Panorama. The morning started with the mighty 200 Series breaking some front wheel studs. Luckily we were in town so it was a quick fix.

We finally started the Bridle Track that wove a very windy and hilly trail along the steep cuttings and over the hills beside the Macquarie and Turon Rivers. We finished the afternoon with our lap of Mount Panorama before heading back to camp.

Monday 16th

Monday morning we all headed off for another full day traveling to get to Myall lakes. After arriving we set up in the caravan park - our base for the next two days.

Tuesday 17th

We stayed at Myall National Park, and it rained though the night. We had a nice slow start to the morning and took advantage of the facilities, including getting some washing done. We eventually left camp around 10am.

We caught a ferry across the river and after a small drive we arrived at Mungos Beach and had a bit of a play. Down the road was Sandy Point where we checked out the beach and saw a dingo! We then stopped at Black Point and the kids played in the sand dunes, before more beach driving on Bennetts Beach.

We had a communal lunch of left overs from dinner the night before. At Bennetts Beach, before we drove back, we aired up & then headed to Mungo Brush. We went for a little walk at Mungo Brush and saw a goanna. Back on the ferry to cross the river again and get back to camp. We had dinner and played some cards all together for a quiet evening.

Wednesday 18th

The next morning we woke up to a cold morning, with ice on the swags and trailers. We tried to use the morning sun to dry a couple of things and hit the road at about 9:30. On the way out of the caravan park we saw a red belly black snake on the road and multiple kookaburras.

After being on the road a while we had a break at Kempsey at the Slim Dusty Museum. We planned on doing the Akubra factory but it has been closed since covid, so we fuelled up and had some free time in Kempsey.

We made our way to camp & were met with a road closure that blocked us from getting to the camp we had planned. After asking a local at the pub, we finally made our way to camp. We camped at Black Bird Flat Reserve campground and had dinner under a little rotunda, then played cards all together.

Thursday 19th

Today we woke up, had breakfast, packed up and hit the road around 9am. We stopped at a camp ground to drop off the campers and the swags before heading out onto the tracks.

We drove on Bicentennial Track, which had many river crossings and was really enjoyable. After the track we had lunch at George's Junction







campground under a bit of shade. We then made a quick pit stop at a little look out before we stopped about 50km out of Coffs at Dangar Falls campground to set up camp for the night. Everyone had dinner and again played some cards all together.

Friday 20th - Monday 23rd **Morbid Trail**

Coffs Harbor is well known for having some of the most difficult 4WD tracks in Australia, and Morbid Trail was a perfect example of a difficult to extreme track.

Immediately upon entering the track, we came across a large tree that required us to move it out of the way. A huge pile of bulldozed dirt was at the entrance of the track, to prevent vehicles that were not capable of attempting the track, from doing just that. Matthew got stuck attempting to drive over the dirt, just lacking the clearance needed. Adam in his 79 series was the only vehicle that went up that section of track, the rest of us went around on what I would normally call the "chicken track" but it was anything but.

The track was rutted out in many places and there were quite a few challenging hill climbs. Adam was quick to rejoin the group, before coming unstuck when he dropped his rear tyre into a rather large hole! Using Andrew's vehicle as an anchor, Adam was able to winch his car out. At this point, Andrew and Rachel left the group, leaving Tyler and Hollie to continue with the group.

It was not long before we ran into trouble again when James popped the tyre off its bead on a steep hill. The difficulty here was jacking the car on the incline. With a bit of creativity, we managed to get the car jacked, fixed, and we were off again.

The track continued in a steep incline and the higher we got, the





more difficult the track became. A couple of hundred metres from the end of the track and we were done. The final part of the track had huge ruts and massive rock steps that would have put the vehicles dangerously off camber. The only way we were getting to the top was by winching and risking damage to our vehicles. So we turned around and headed back to camp for lunch.

Convincing Ground Trail


After lunch we thought we'd do a medium track, as we had two L platers driving. Two vehicles headed out to drive Convincing Ground Trail, but one wrong turn found us back on a difficult track. The track was incredibly overgrown, so a bit of scrub clearing was required and our car earnt a few new pin stripes as a result. This track also had a few challenges including steep uphill inclines, rutted out sections and one narrow section where we had to avoid a huge hole on one side and a tree on the other. A shout out to Tyler who drove this track superbly in the 79 series, even if he did give the tree a light tap!

Beach Driving

Today we thought we'd take it down a notch and do some beach driving. We started the day with a walk along the jetty, watching the whales breach the water and dolphins swim past. It took us a while to actually find the entrance to the beach, but when we did, we drove the Coffs Beach without any hassles.

After Coffs Beach run we headed to Woolgoolga. The tide was too high to drive the beach, so we headed to the foreshore for some lunch and a swim.

In the afternoon we headed back to the beach. The tide had dropped so we gave it a go. We hadn't bothered to let down our tyres so it was no surprise when Tyler became stuck in the sand. Lower tyre pressures and a quick snatch and he was on his way again. We had a great time cruising up and down the beach for





the afternoon before cleaning the cars and heading back to camp.

Tuesday 24 September

The group split in two today. Matthew, Juanita & Adam spent the day 4WDing. Rachael & Bec took all the kids to the Big Banana for the day where they had an absolute blast, while Andrew and James separately spent a few hours in town doing odd jobs.

Wednesday 25th September

We left camp about 9am and headed to Bindarri National Park with the intention to take the 4WD tracks to Bangalore Falls.

We spent several hours travelling on some rough tracks as well as some very overgrown tracks. Enroute we met two other vehicles travelling in the same direction. One of the vehicles had hit a tree stump and damaged his rim, so we had to wait some time for that to be changed over.

As we progressed, the tracks were becoming very overgrown and we were spending a lot of time clearing the tracks of fallen trees so we made the decision to turn around and head to Bangalore Falls via the main road. It was a short 1.2km walk to the falls for a look before heading back to camp, arriving around 4pm.

Thursday 26th September

With the official end to the trip. Matthew & Juanita and Adam commenced their drive home.

The Fitzpatrick & the Smith families headed north to Kingscliff where they will spend the next 6 days exploring the area, enjoying the beach, and taking on the Gold Coast theme parks. The kids are really looking forward to this.

TRACK CLEARING

Another track clearing is done and dusted (literally, it was pretty dry and dusty on the tracks). It was great to have a few people available for both days this year, something we will work on building in future years.

The track clearing & opening weekend has been running now for over 20 years - a partnership between Parks Victoria, DEECA, Four Wheel Drive Victoria, and the local clubs surrounding the Otways.

Working together this ensures that the tracks in the area that are part of the seasonal closures are checked, cleared and re-opened safely, ready for the summer season.

Saturday we were able to run two teams - with one heading to Deans Marsh to work with the Bellarine 4x4 Club, and the other heading down to Gellibrand to assist with the Otway 4WD Club and Warrnambool 4WD Club.

Four vehicles - Keith, Harley, Ken, John and Geoff, met at Moriac then onto Deans Marsh for a briefing with the Bellarine 4WD club. After tracks were allocated all vehicles headed off together for Dunse Track, which only had a few trees to clear.

We then proceeded to Thompsons
Track via Benwerrin - Mt Sabine Rd.
We parted ways with the Bellarine
crew and it was just Geelong doing
this track which had to be cleared to



approximately four metres wide as it is a primary access for emergency vehicles. Not many large trees down, but a lot of small branches that did not require cutting. Then it was onto Newcombe Spur Track. This was a totally different track to Thompsons Track. The vegetation is very close and there is a couple of interesting creek crossings at the start, then it becomes an easy drive. There were a lot of trees across the track, so progress was fairly slow. We had lunch about halfway down the track, then continued on to Hayden Track which had very little clearing for us to do. We came back onto Thompsons Track and then back to Benwerrin - Mt Sabine Road where we aired up. John and Geoff went to Big Hill campground for more clearing on Sunday. Keith, Harley and Ken headed home via Barwon Downs. It was a great day enjoyed by all.

Our other four vehicle team of Danny, Daniel, PJ, Graeme and Nathan headed to Colac and met up with John Carew from the Otways 4WD Club. We stopped at Gellibrand and met with the rest of the crew, including members from the Warrnambool 4WD Club. Splitting into two teams with two chainsaw operators in each team, we headed out onto the tracks that needed to be checked and cleared. It wasn't long before the saws were











out and we were clearing many trees across the tracks. We managed to clear Rifle Range Track, Bunker Hill Track and Old Carlisle Track before we stopped for lunch at Carlisle River. Both teams made good time allowing us to catch up for lunch at the same time.

After lunch we ran as one combined larger team, which allowed us to 'leap frog' each other and fairly quicky clear another four tracks before we called it a day. It was a great night around the fire, with a few refreshments to clear the dust.

Sunday saw us clear all of our usual allocated tracks along with Garvey & Sharps tracks. It was great to have John on the chainsaw for the day where he was able to get some good practice on a variety of trees that needed clearing. With all our tracks cleared and opened it was time to head home after a great weekend.
