

GREAT AUSTRALIAN BIGHT


Date: Saturday 20th September - Sunday 12th October

Meeting: Option 1: Ampol, Bannockburn. Saturday 20th September, 6.15am. Option 2: Tourist Info Centre, Port Augusta. Sunday 21st September, 9am.

Option 3: Esperance, WA. No later than the night of Thursday 25th September.



Trip Details: We will begin our trip by crossing the Nullarbor along the Eyre Highway, followed by a few days of rest in Esperance, WA. From there, we'll make our way back across The Great Australian Bight, exploring beaches and costal tracks.

This trip has been rated as medium to hard, as the beach driving becomes increasingly challenging the further east we go. The return leg across the Bight, from Esperance to Ceduna, spans approximately 1,400 km. We'll aim to cover about 100 km per day in the more difficult terrain, which, while it may not sound like much, will involve slow and demanding driving.

We've allocated 15 days to complete the crossing, finishing in Ceduna, SA. Should we finish ahead of schedule, an optional trip up Googs Track will be available for those interested.

Requirements: Participants must have the following - A reliable set of recovery tracks (e.g. MaxTrax), front and rear recovery points, spare tyres and a tyre repair kit, long Handled Shovel, basic recovery gear, including a snatch strap, sufficient fuel, water, and food to last the duration of this remote trip.

Our first opportunity to refuel will be on Day 7, and the first water resupply will be on Day 9, likely from a bore water source. This trip will be strictly tents and swags only—no campers. For those interested, fishing and surfing opportunities may be available along the way.

The trip began at our Clubrooms with half of the trip attendees, the others would be meeting at camp later that evening or the following morning.

With a cruisy drive towards
Moonambel, we stopped in at Lake
Learmonth for a quick rest and to get
the pies into the ovens in
preparation for lunch. From
Learmonth we stopped again in
Avoca to quickly refuel for the
weekend ahead of us before hitting
the road again.

Once arriving at the Moonambel Recreation Reserve the convoy was quick to begin setting up camp so we could hit a few tracks before dinner. Airing down the tires, we set off for an adventure through some easy to medium difficulty tracks including Farnsworth Track, Jacksons Track, Main Break, New Nowhere Track - with a loop detour through the bush where trees would become quite tight, requiring ample attention to navigation - No 2. Creek Track and Sardine Track, where there were some steep rocky sections that required careful wheel placement and slow crawling to navigate the terrain.

On the way back from our run we took a detour to see some mines on

the way home. Unfortunately, these have the entrance barricaded and the gates locked now.

With the first day of driving over we had our first casualty with Ken taking a sidewall puncture to the rear drivers tyre.

The second day started slow, waiting for the remainder of the convoy to arrive first thing in the morning. The plan was to have a relaxing day with a short morning trip before lunch at the Summerfields winery. Following Geoff, we headed up Potter Track to a challenging section that had a bypass to the side. Half of us opted





to take the bypass leaving this section to the better equipped and more talented before moving up to a lookout over the Redbank Nature Conservation Reserve and a couple of group photos.

Leaving the lookout, we took a steep decent down through Potter Track, Camp House Track, Dead Man's Track and Greens Lane before joining back into Potter Track and heading back to camp to freshen up for lunch. However, as everyone was getting thirsty, we all rushed off in 3 cars to the winery while somehow leaving a man behind. Graeme came back from the shower block with not a person in sight, his only saviour from a long walk being Geoff speeding back down the road to pick him up. Reunited, we all dined on woodfired pizzas, wine and beer until we were the last ones left from the lunch rush.

After leaving the winery we all started to settle into our camp chairs and beverages for the afternoon, chatting late into the night.

We started our final day of driving after a hearty breakfast and coffee before heading for our biggest driving day for the weekend. With Kenny not wanting to risk another puncture he jumped in with Graeme. We began our adventure



on Squatter Track to warm ourselves up for the challenges ahead before moving onto Billy Goat Track where a fallen tree blocked the track, threatening to roll down the hill if not cut in the right places. Geoff made quick work of the tree by chainsawing it into a more manageable size while the convoy had the cars parked safely away from the dangers of a rolling tree.

Tim was able to get his Stedi Patrol off to the side to winch the remainder of the tree off the track into a safe position where it wouldn't roll down the hill, before the convoy continued onto Black Range and Dridan Track. We made a small detour to attempt the start of Old Kingtree Track for a steep and difficult challenge. Only a handful of cars attempted the section as it required steady control of the throttle and careful wheel placement to ensure you didn't scrape against a tree or get stuck in one of the many holes. Everyone that did try this section succeeded without any issues and the convoy then continued onto Cameron Campground along Cameron Track.

However, along Cameron Track there were a couple of rock steps that needed to be navigated carefully and unfortunately Nathan tried to follow the big boys, slipping off the line and taking a dent to his











fuel tank. Luckily there was no significant damage and no fuel was leaking so we all continued on.

Once at Cameron Campground we met up with the Warrnambool 4WD Club where we had lunch and Geoff went to fulfil presidential relations with the other club.

After lunch we bid farewell to the Warrnambool club and Timmy, who had to drive off to Brisbane, and made our way to Old Tiger Cat Track. The rest of the day was spent driving various tracks with steep climbs and descents causing our water and transmission temps to rise and fall with the terrain. The convoy continued through Old Mill Track, Emery Track, Frasers Track, Old Bluff Track, No 2 Creek Track and again finishing on Sardines Track.

The trip wouldn't be complete however without another bit of damage - this time to Graeme who got a puncture while going through Sardine Track. Ken's bad luck from the previous day was brought with him as a passenger with Graeme.

With the driving finished for the day everyone sat down to enjoy a drink while Nathan and Alma went for a swim at the local pool. Before long everyone had to scramble for cover as heavy rain rolled through forcing



everyone to find shelter. Nathan and Alma lowered their gazebo into a little hobbit hut and dug trenches to keep water out while the others fled to the cover of the Rec Centre's veranda. The rain not letting up, everyone bunkered down into their campers and swags for the night waiting for the clear skies of the morning.

The warm and sunny morning of the final day arrived to reveal the still muddy ground and drenched campsite. A slow start for the day, everyone let their gear dry a little in the sun while having coffee and breakfast before packing up. The trip was now over. Fun was had by all and with the sun high above us we all began to head home one by one heading our own separate ways.

Our March general meeting for 2025 was held at the ARB Geelong showroom on Thompson Road.


